Our furniture consists of high-quality, exclusive individual pieces that are custom-made or produced in small series. Each item is handcrafted in Germany by our master carpenters. Only the finest and most carefully selected materials are used. To ensure long-lasting enjoyment of your furniture and to optimally care for its valuable surface, please observe the following guidelines:

Please do not use strong liquid cleaners, abrasive or scouring agents under any circumstances. Furniture polishes, waxes and solvents are also unsuitable for cleaning our furniture surfaces and will cause more harm than good.

Please note that microfibre cloths vary in texture and may cause damage to the fronts.

Do not use steam cleaners, as they can cause the material to swell and ultimately destroy the furniture.

To avoid marks and stains, do not leave water or damp objects on the surfaces for extended periods.

Never apply self-adhesive films or tapes, as the solvent residues and plasticisers they contain can damage the lacquer finish of your furniture.

REAL WOOD VENEERED SURFACES

Real wood veneered surfaces consist of a high-quality P3-bonded chipboard (designation of the bonding), veneered on both sides with 0.6–0.7 mm real wood such as oak or walnut (or other native woods), and finished with a high-grade satin matt two-component lacquer (total thickness 19 mm).

Wood is a natural material with inherent variations in colour, grain and texture. Differences caused by exposure to light and sunlight may lead to discolouration and are a natural characteristic of the material; they do not constitute grounds for complaint. Always ensure your wooden furniture is exposed to light evenly. A permanently placed object will prevent the wood beneath it from darkening naturally.

The veneered surfaces are protected by high-quality, multi-layered lacquers. However, water or damp objects should not remain on the surfaces for long periods, as this may cause staining.

Cleaning is best carried out with a slightly damp cloth (e.g. chamois leather). Always wipe in the direction of the wood grain. To ensure that no moisture remains in profiles, corners or along edges, always dry the surfaces thoroughly afterwards.

Contamination must not be allowed to dry and should be removed immediately.

Please never use aggressive or abrasive products, polishes, waxes or steam cleaners.
