



domovari - Mirrors and Mirror Cabinets

The frame of your mirror, as well as the interior and the carcass of your mirror cabinet, may be made of mineral matt, decorative board, lacquered surfaces or real wood veneer. Please follow the care instructions corresponding to the respective material. The following recommendations apply to the mirror surfaces:

DAILY CLEANING – DUST AND FINE PARTICLES

Use a dry, soft microfibre cloth or a duster. This minimises the risk of scratches during subsequent damp cleaning.

LIGHT SOILING

Spray mild glass cleaner, water or a gentle cleaning solution (e.g. 1:5 vinegar–water) onto a cloth — never directly onto the mirror. Wipe in smooth, even strokes from top to bottom to reduce streaking, then dry and polish the surface with a clean, lint-free microfibre cloth.

Do not use aggressive cleaners, ammonia-based products, strong alcohol solutions, pure vinegar concentrates or harsh chemical agents. These may damage the mirror's backing and cause what is known as "mirror rot" —

corrosion of the reflective layer, which results in clouding and spotting.

STUBBORN DIRT

For make-up or hairspray residue, you may apply 70% isopropyl alcohol locally using a cloth. For white water or limescale marks, a paste of baking powder and water can help; apply gently and wipe off again.

Clean the mirror no more than once per week — daily cleaning increases the risk of damage. Ensure that no moisture penetrates the edges of the mirror; always dry thoroughly afterwards.

Ensure good ventilation in the room, especially after showering, to keep humidity levels low.
