

# domovari - ceram

*ceram* is the name given to domovari's porcelain stoneware surfaces. Porcelain stoneware is a highly developed material made entirely from mineral components. The surface is fired at very high temperatures, making it particularly durable. The result is a dense, sealed structure with a pleasantly natural feel – hygienic, food-safe and easy to maintain.

## DAILY CLEANING

The fired surface of ceram is especially resistant to the usual stresses encountered in the home – both in the kitchen and in the bathroom. Typical stains such as tea, coffee, fruit juices, fats or oils, as well as residues of toothpaste, soap or cosmetics, can be effortlessly removed with a damp cloth and a neutral cleaner (e.g. glass cleaner).

# **HEAVY SOILING**

For more stubborn residues – such as dried-on food, make-up or skincare products – we recommend using mild, non-abrasive cleaners (e.g. Frosch neutral cleaner) or a gentle cream cleaner. Dried-on dirt can be carefully removed with a blunt scraper. The surface should then be rinsed thoroughly with clean water to completely remove all residues.

#### LIMESCALE DEPOSITS

Limescale, which may appear as dull patches, can be effectively removed using standard vinegar cleaner or vinegar essence (25%). If necessary, the treatment can be repeated.

### HEAT RESISTANCE AND MECHANICAL STRESS

Although ceram is highly resistant to temperature, we generally recommend using a trivet when placing hot pots or pans directly on the surface. To avoid scratches, all cutting should be carried out on a chopping board.
